a) Summary of meeting held with proposed allotment holders on 26th March 2024.

Update: 12 people attended the meeting, plots where allocated. Non attendees have been offered plots. The allotment area to be staked out w/c 8th April 2024, plots will be numbered. Requests to improve access path, Parish Council (PC) to look into this. Water to be connected by the PC. A hut may be erected to contain a compost toilet. Wild flowers will be planted at the far end in the open space. Small shrubs to be planted by the PC to create privacy and contain water to assist in the prevention of flooding in the nearby houses.
